Roles and Responsibilities

The Provincial Outreach Program for the Early Years (POPEY) welcomes you as a District Partner. Below are the roles, responsibilities, and characteristics of a POPEY District Partner.

Role & Responsibilities:

- Act as a liaison between POPEY and your district to facilitate the sharing of early literacy initiatives, resources, information, and support possibilities for primary educators
- Share updates from POPEY with your district
- Help coordinate professional learning opportunities for primary educators
- Promote POPEY webinars, online workshops, and the POPEY website
- Share the needs of your district with POPEY

Characteristics of a POPEY District Partner:

Ideally, the District Partner for POPEY will be a committed and passionate educator with experience in primary literacy education and supporting diverse learners.

A District Partner may be a teacher, consultant, coordinator, or director – all supporting literacy initiatives in the primary grades.

What might a District Partner do?

Each district is unique and has different service delivery models, processes, and policies for providing support for educators of K-3 students. Your opportunities for engagement as a POPEY District Partner may differ from other districts due to the varied size, geographical location (rural and remote), and needs of the districts across the province.

Communicate and Connect

- Network with POPEY and other districts to explore initiatives, innovative approaches, and resources; then share back with your district.

Build Capacity

- Liaise with POPEY to provide educators in your district with professional learning opportunities.
